

**UJIMA: the African American Achievement Ceremony

The purpose of Ujima is to celebrate the success of African American/Black students at the University of Texas at San Antonio. During this ceremony, one student will be recognized with an award for their continued involvement in the African American/Black community at UTSA and/or San Antonio. The Community Involvement Award will be given to the student whose community involvement best match the Ujima principles of Collective Work and Responsibility. This award recognizes the student who best applies these principles to enhance the experience of African American and Black students during their matriculation at UTSA.

In addition, the Community Involvement Award is rewarded to the African American/Black student who has best served the African American/Black community of San Antonio and/or UTSA as a leader of an organization or event. Also, the Community Involvement Award recognizes the student who best maintains a Good Academic Standing while being active in community service projects. Finally, the Community Involvement Award recognizes the student who best exemplifies a positive character and encouraging attitude.

- Nominees must be registered at UTSA for the Spring semester of 2011.
- Nominees must be in Good Academic Standing (Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above).
