

**UJIMA: the African American Achievement Ceremony

The purpose of the Ujima ceremony is to celebrate the success of African American/Black students at The University of Texas at San Antonio. During this ceremony, one student will be recognized with an award for their role as a leader at UTSA. The Leadership Award will be given to the student whose leadership actions best match the principles of Ujima: Collective Work and Responsibility. In addition, the Leadership Award is rewarded to the African American/Black student who best serves UTSA as a leader of an organization or event. Also, the Leadership Award is for the student who best maintains a Good Academic Standing while being active in a student organizations and/or event. Finally, the Leadership Award recognizes the student who best exemplifies a positive character and encouraging attitude.

- Nominees must be in Good Academic Standing (Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above).
